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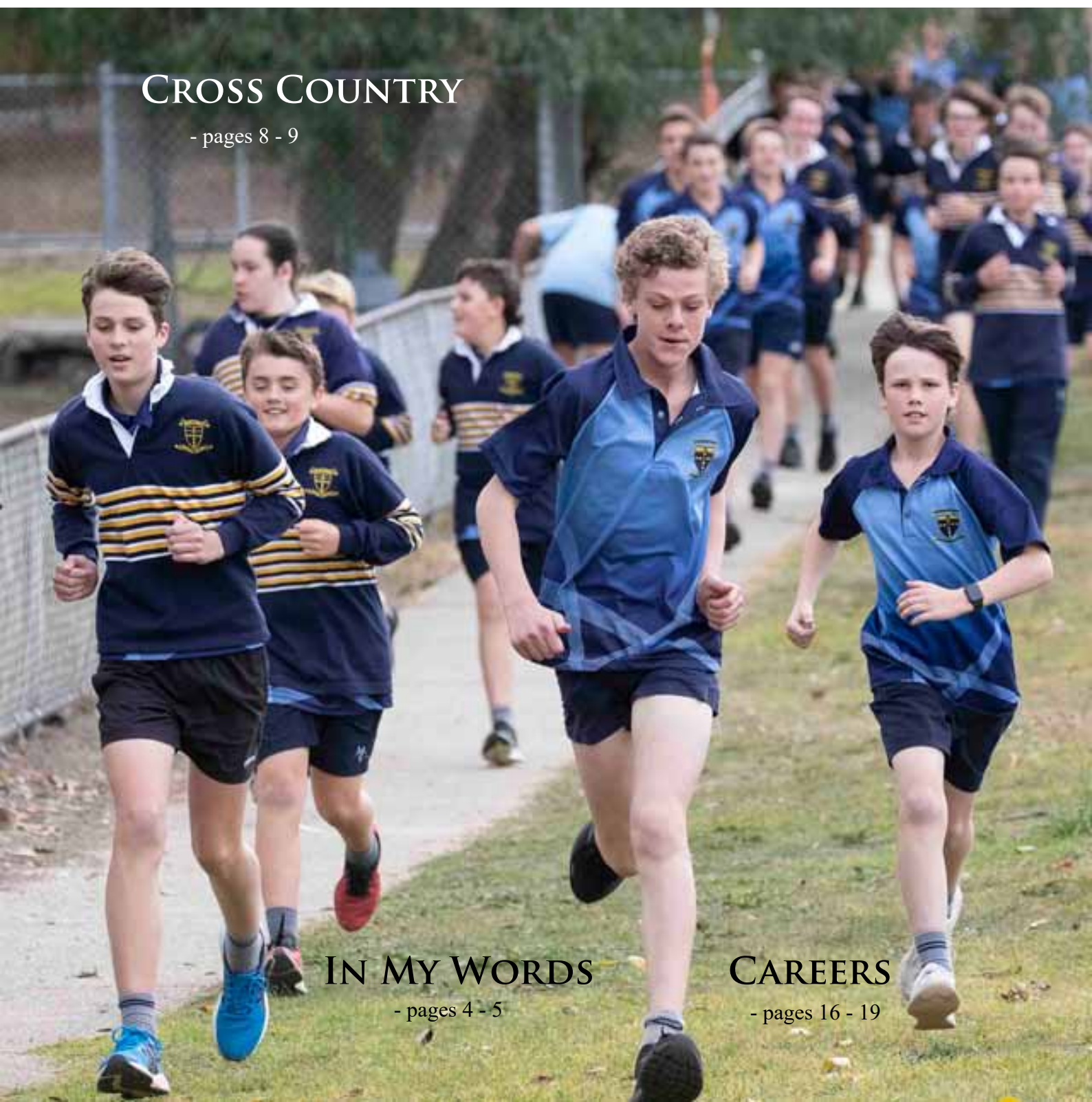

Deakin Students Visit

On Thursday 29th April we had two fourth and final year students from the Deakin University Ballarat Clinical School of Medicine, Milla and Ellie, come do a presentation to some of our VCE students.

Milla and Ellie spoke about their individual pathways into this course, what they studied as undergraduates and why they decided to apply for medicine. They also went into great detail about the course itself and they mentioned that many of the students in this course have come from a wide variety of undergraduate degrees eg. law, music, nursing etc. You do not have to have an undergraduate degree in biomedical science to apply for the Doctor of Medicine program at Deakin University

Deakin University is passionate about keeping regional students, regional. The University is working hard to make it increasingly more accessible and

equitable to study medicine if you are from a regional or rural area. This year 30 undergraduate students from rural areas, who met the entry requirements, were offered places into the Doctor of Medicine (MD) on the Rural Training Scheme (RTS), removing the need for them to compete with students from Geelong, Bellarine or Melbourne. It is hoped that the RTS is a step in the direction to reaching the ultimate goal of being able to support rural high school graduates to study the undergraduate degree of their choice and majority of their MD in their home town.

Milla and Ellie have both done a placement at East Grampians Health Service as part of their final year and both girls intend to stay rural after graduating.

Applying Medicine, Dentistry or Oral Health?

If you are in Year 12 and plan to apply for any of these health science courses to start in 2022, you may need to sit the UCAT ANZ (University Clinical Aptitude Test).

The UCAT ANZ is a two-hour, computer-based test which assesses a range of mental abilities identified by universities as important to practicing in the fields of medicine and dentistry.

It consists of five separately timed subtests which each contain a number of questions in a multiple-choice format.

You will sit the test in July 2021 and selected universities use your UCAT ANZ results as part of the selection process, in conjunction with your ATAR and HSC/VCE results, and in some cases an interview.

You will only have one chance to sit the UCAT ANZ this year. It's important to note that applications close on the 17th of May and late applications close on the 31st of May.

My Career Match offers the following advice to students preparing to attend a career expo:

List the priority exhibitors with the 'must visit' at the top of list. If they are busy make a time to come back and see them. Don't leave the expo without visiting the "must see" exhibitors.

Allocate time to spend with each of your priority exhibitors. Non priority exhibitors can be visited if you have time.

Prepare an introduction. Keep it short. Introduce yourself and say why you're interested in this career or a particular study area.

Have a list of questions to ask. Don't leave it to memory. Take notes and gather information. Ask for their business card or get their name and email to follow up.

Take the visit seriously. It's about your future so it's important you focus and don't get distracted.
