Well done to the many students who have demonstrated high engagement and effort throughout the term in all areas of the curriculum. This week we start the new Semester 2 timetable for the Junior school. New beginnings are opportunities to challenge yourself and set realistic goals for the next stage. Every student has an opportunity to be the best version of themself. Holidays are a time to refresh and renew, and to emerge with a new energy and plan for the challenges and joys of the term ahead.

Plans for our new STEM / RESOURCE Centre are coming along well with the design to go to tender around October. This will be an exciting new stage for the College as we create a new flexible learning centre to support greater differentiation to meet the needs of students at all levels.

Professional Learning

A wonderful opportunity has arisen for our English staff to participate in professional learning in Semester 2. Catholic Education Ballarat has partnered with renowned literacy and school improvement consultant Kirstin Bourne to deliver a Pilot Program for 7-10 English teachers, focused on creating an engaging and effective English curriculum.

This Project will align with our whole school priorities for improved literacy across the school, and supports our commitment to best practice. The benefits of the accompanying resources and tapping into expert knowledge and collegial networks are many.

Our engagement in the Improving Literacy in the Secondary Years (ILSY) project will continue concurrently and complement our whole-school improvement priority for improving literacy levels across the College.

Wellbeing and Engagement

Over the last six months or so, most schools report an increase in wellbeing matters that appears to be related to the disruptions evidenced during the

COVID period. Often these wellbeing matters to emerge post pandemic are closely linked to increase in challenging behaviours, bullying and disengagement. I know as a College we are most successful in addressing any challenges as they arise when we partner with parents in a concerted effort to address matters, whether online or face-to-face.

Our wellbeing classes work alongside our Teacher Advisor program to support all students. But like most schools, we know there is more to do to ensure no student 'falls between the cracks' or disrupts others as they navigate adjustments post pandemic. Most significantly, it is formally inducting students into our Marian culture and the values that are so important to who we are and what we stand for. As the next stage in this journey, our Wellbeing team and leadership will work closely with a highly experienced Behavioural Management consultant to undertake an intensive training program to best support students as they navigate the teenage years. This important opportunity aligns beautifully with our strong values at the college, our wraparound care and focus on positive relationships and wellbeing. Over time, the skills and resources will be embedded within a number of subject areas including Wellbeing.

Reading

As part of the ILSY (Improving Literacy in the Secondary Years) program, the focus for 2023 is Reading. 2022 was Oracy and 2024 will be Writing. Staff meet each fortnight to continue the project and implement and assess strategies within their teaching areas to support student improvement. Why is this so important? We know that:

1. Language is foundational to all learning experiences (Vygotsky, 1962).

- Literacy is complex continuously evolving
- 3. Students need to be taught disciplinary literacy
- 4. Literacy needs to be explicitly taught and scaffolded
- 5. All language modes (listening, speaking, reading, viewing and writing) are interrelated. Improving the students' ability in one language mode, improves their ability in the other modes.
- 6. The development of a shared language for talking about literacy empowers student learning

The results we are seeing in literacy improvement are encouraging. Regular reading at home even for a short period can enhance this journey. The holidays are a great time to choose a book to explore something new and exciting.

Well done to the senior students who sat the General Achievement Test (GAT) this week. This is the first external assessment in the lead up to the VCE/VM final exams in Term 4.


House Day



know, wetsuits become heavy once wet, so when I jumped into the water, my wetsuit started getting very heavy and my body sank even though I had a kickboard.






