






Dear Parents, Carers, Friends and Students of Marian College,

This past week saw a happy return to some school events that had previously been cancelled due to Covid in 2020.

Thank you to all those who got up there for Marian's Got Talent, knowing it was less about them and their talents as it was a chance to raise more money for those less fortunate as the crowd "voted" for their favourite acts by contributing coins to a bucket.

In times such as these, when young people see the state of the world and often feel a little helpless, Fred Hyde day proves that we can look for small ways to make a difference and be a part of contributing something good into the world. The boys kept the pressure scoring 4 goals in the first half and another 4 in the second to run out 7 goal winners to finish 2nd in the Greater Western Region.

STEM at Marian College




