Child Safety update

Professional boundaries to keep students safe.

Below are some examples of information that staff have worked through in relation to maintaining professional boundaries with students outside of school and in relation to online communication with students.

Outside School Contact

In a rural setting, especially, contact with students and families outside the school can occur through shared community activities, where familial relationships exist, or through accidental contact. Staff must not have contact with a student outside the school without knowledge of the Principal, the Head of Wellbeing, or governing authority, (Kildare Education Ministries) for unauthorised tutoring,

private instrumental/other lessons or sport coaching, and without a valid context.

All contacts through shared community activities, such as these but not limited to, coaching and family relationships that exist between a staff member and students and their family, should be registered with the College immediately. Details of the connection and purpose should be emailed to the Principal and Head of Wellbeing for recording on the school register. These are reviewed annually. Accidental contact such as seeing a student in their workplace or in the street, is considered as incidental.

Online Communication

Staff must not have any online contact with a student (including social media, email, instant messaging etc.,) outside the school's official means of communications and for educational purposes only. If an emergency arises, staff have been asked to contact the Principal and parent of the student directly to discuss the matter.

COMPLETE THEATRE WORKS PERFORMANCE OF MACBETH

On Tuesday 16th of August, the Complete Works Theatre Company came to Marian College and presented a shortened version of Macbeth to the year 10s. There were three actors: Wolfgang, Claire and Josh, and they shared the roles between them. Josh played the roles of Macbeth and a witch. Claire played Lady Macbeth as well as one of the weird sisters, Malcolm and some other minor roles. Wolfgang played Banquo, and did a really good job as the porter.

Before the play started the actors told the audience about the history of the play and how it would have been if you had watched it 400 years ago. They told us about the Gunpowder Plot and how people would have viewed the crime of killing a king. Then they did the opening scene with the witches. After that, they explained the background of that scene. They performed the entire play in this way, acting for a bit before stopping to explain it.
