



Bullying and Cyberbullying

Post COVID, many schools across Victoria are reporting an increase in Bullying and Cyber-Bullying as students emerge from a deficit of opportunities to develop positive and enriching relationships that respect diversity and inclusion of all students. It takes time and opportunities to build

strong relationships and a shared culture and language. Inclusion (Hospitality) and respect (Justice) are two of our core values at Marian College. We know that post pandemic it is crucial that we equip ourselves and our students with the knowledge and strategies to address this issue of bullying effectively. This is new territory for many of us. Bullying today is often quite insidious and emerging as fast as technology is evolving.

As our trainer, Robert Periera suggests:
`...Bullying among children and teens is a phenomenon that many adults do not understand. Teachers are not taught how to respond to this growing problem. Policy statements are not sufficient to address the complexities experienced by children of all age groups.

Hence my aim is to:

- a) enlighten teachers and parents in their understanding of the complexities that are central to the bullying problem
- b) provide them with a process that has proven to be effective in addressing this complexity.
- c) engender compassion and justice among children and teens, which will assist in reducing bullying among individuals.
- d) foster better thinking among children and teens, which then translates into more appropriate behaviours in social settings'. (Robert Periera 2023)

Our Plan of Action at Marian College

Leadership and our House Leaders at Marian College have started an intense program with Educational Consultant and international specialist on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy to Address Bullying. The program provides a contemporary understanding of Bullying in its many forms and why either boys or girls bully.





This program includes practical strategies to address bullying with students through shared understandings of the motives and impact of bullying, empathy, and empowerment of bystanders, victims and those who bully. While many of us were skeptical at first, our experience was quite the opposite. We have started trialing lesson plans with various student groups and will continue discussion and sharing of our experiences and outcomes.

Parent Engagement

It is important that we tackle this issue together and in a proactive manner rather than reactive. We know that addressing any issue is more effective when we work together with students, staff and parents. With this in mind, we have booked a free webinar for parents to explore two sessions delivered by our consultant:

1. Why Boys Bully and 2. Why Girls Bully. The school will cover all costs for parents. Please save the date for the evening of **17th September** for the first one and a half hour session. More details include the webinar link and times will be forwarded in the next week or so.

Over the last two weeks and again this week, we are excited to warmly welcome Year 6 students to begin their Orientation into Marian College for 2024. 



REMINDERS - VICTORIAN UNI APPLICATIONS

Applying for nursing or midwifery?

Once you have applied for a nursing or midwifery course via VTAC, you will be required to complete the 'Nursing and Midwifery Declaration Form'. This is located in your VTAC account under 'Making an Application'.

Initial teacher education - Victoria

Students planning to apply for initial teacher education courses in Victoria for the 2024 intake are required to sit the Casper test: CSP 10409 – Australian Undergraduate Teacher Education.

REMINDERS - NSW/ACT UNI APPLICATIONS

Applying for nursing or midwifery?

Once you have applied for a nursing or midwifery course via UAC, you will be required to submit an 'English proficiency declaration'. The declaration will appear once you review your course preferences.

Applying for a teaching degree?

You may need to complete the Teaching Questionnaire in your UAC account. You may also need to complete a 'motivation to teach' statement direct to the university.

Applying for a course that requires a folio, interview, design task or audition?

Once you add the course/s to your Tertiary Admission Centre preference list and submit your application, you will be emailed information about the additional selection criteria you need to complete.

ACCOMMODATION

If you have to move away to study, you will need to consider accommodation options. If you would like to live on-campus, you will need to start considering your options now as some universities are 'first in, first served'.

Steps to apply for on-campus accommodation

- Make an Excel sheet or table in Word.
- List the universities you are applying to.
- Google the university and the term 'accommodation'
- In your table, list the types of accommodation available (e.g., studio, shared apartment, catered, non-catered)
- Then list the weekly or yearly price for each option and the contract period.
- List the application method, the closing date, cost to apply and if a deposit is required.
- Speak to your family about budget considerations.
- Then tick off the accommodation you have applied for once this is completed.
