2023

As Mrs Barker outlined in last week's newsletter, the school spent the better part of a year reviewing key areas of the school which included assessment and the school timetable.

A key outcome of this review was that more class time was needed in the key

priority areas of the school, literacy and numeracy.

As part of the process moving forward into 2023 we have decided to expand the early start program to include all year levels. This will entail all students moving into next year's classes, from Year 7 through to Year 11. This year's early start for all students will begin on Monday the 21st of November.

At the same time our school day will also alter. We will move from a 6 (47 minute) period day to a 5 (1 hour) period day. The new bell times are listed at the end of this article.

The benefits of this include more time being allocated to English and Math as well as an increase in time allocation in all senior school subjects. We are hopeful that the early start will help highlight any issues that can be dealt with prior to the new school year in 2023.

For this to happen, Mr Coghlan has been working very hard to make sure that we have a new timetable in place for November 21st. This means that over the next week or so all students from Yr 9 upwards will receive their subjects for 2023.

At the same time the Wellbeing team have been revising class groups for Year 7 going into 8 as well as core groupings for students going into Year 9 and 10. Once completed this will be followed by families receiving information on booklists, electronic levies etc.

VCE Exams

Much has been written over the past few weeks in regards to our Seniors sitting their external exams. As of today the process is well underway. Well done to all the students so far and we wish them continued success over the next few weeks.

As a school we will have the time to celebrate with them at graduation on Thursday the 17th of November.

7-10 Social

Last Thursday night was a fantastic celebration at the Ararat Town Hall. The Year 10's, along with Mr Armstrong and Miss Rusden organised a wonderful mix of old time dancing with a few newer songs.

All students thoroughly enjoyed themselves. Congratulations to everyone.

2023 SUBJECT INFORMATION

The College has completed a full school review of the timetable and our curriculum structure. The results of the review will see the College make a number of significant changes to the curriculum structure in 2023.

The most significant being a move to a 5 period day in 2023. The lessons will be 1 hour long with the lunch break being after period 2 at 11am. This will have different implications in different year levels.

Year 11 and 12 students

Each VCE class will have 4 one hour lessons per subject per week in 2023. The objective is to give more time to subjects and also more sessions.

Therefore a full Year 12 VCE load will be 5 Unit 3 & 4 subjects, plus Religion and Wellbeing.

Some Year 12 students in the changeover year (2023) who previously had completed an accelerated subject in Year 11 may only complete 4 subjects in Year 12. The school, in discussions with students, have also discussed accelerated programs for students entering Year 10 and 11 and will continue to do so into the future.

VCAL and VCE Vocational Major are only affected in terms of the structure of their day and how their practical sessions will be organised.

Year 9 and 10 students

There has been a significant restructure of the middle years timetable. The middle years will have a subject rotation each term instead of

the current semester changes.

A middle years student will complete 4 periods a week of English and Maths, and 2 periods a week of Religion and Physical Education each term. They will also complete 4 periods of 3 other subjects a week during each term. This will consist of one term units in Science, LOTE, Humanities, Arts and Technology or for a Year 10 student, a VCE subject over the year.

The Arts and Technology electives are no longer blocked against each other which has allowed more students access to the subjects they have nominated.

Year 7 and 8 students

Year 7 and 8 students will have more time in English and Maths in 2023 and their Arts and Technology subjects will rotate on a term basis. Term 1 and 2, the Year 8's will complete 2 terms of Art, and a term of Technology: Wood and Food. The Year 7's will do Textiles and Drama in term 1 and Digital Technology and Music in term 2. Then swap for terms 3 and 4.

The students will be receiving a list of their subjects for 2023 in the next few days. The lists will be handed out in class and explained to students.

STATE ATHLETICS

On Monday the 17th of October we had 4 students travel down to Lakeside Stadium in Albert Park to compete in State Athletics.

Darcy Venn was first up in the 12/13 years 80 metre hurdles. She ran a time of 15.08 seconds to finish 4th in the state.

Sophie Birch was next up in the 12/13 years high jump. After setting the record at GWR athletics Sophie improved on her jump to clear 1.45 metres seeing her place 4th. Sophie missed out on a medal on a countback.

Elise Monaghan competed in 2 events. Her first was the 18 years High jump in which she placed 6th and her second event which she ran a time of 5.54.43 which also saw her place 6th in the state.

Brad Carter was the final competitor and he was competing in the 16 years 200 metres. He ran a time of 25.02 seconds which saw him place 5th in the state.

Congratulations to all students on making it through to State Athletics! It's a massive achievement!

Welcome to another Synnott House report.


I hope everyone had an enjoyable long weekend. I am thinking it was a good chance for a mid term break as we need to ensure that we finish off the year strongly.

The library does not have multiple copies of texts to loan out to students.




YEAR 7 2023 PARENT ACCESS MODULE
