The school has focused on improved literacy and numeracy, not only in Math and English but all subject areas.


We have also altered programs to allow term based subjects to have more time weekly for students to engage in deeper learning.



# VCE & the VCE Vocational Major (previously VCAL)

The Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) is Victoria's senior secondary qualification. It opens pathways to university, higher-level TAFE or VET certificate courses, apprenticeships, traineeships and the workforce.

The VCE has expanded to include the Vocational Major, a new **2-year** vocational and applied learning program. It has replaced Senior and Intermediate VCAL.



## VCE Vocational Major (replacing VCAL for Year 11)

To be eligible to receive the VCE VM, students must satisfactorily complete a minimum of 16 units over two years including:

- 3 VCE VM Literacy or VCE English units (including a Unit 3–4 sequence)
- 2 VCE VM Numeracy or VCE Mathematics units
- 2 VCE VM Work Related Skills units
- 2 VCE VM Personal Development Skills units, and
- 2 VET credits at Certificate II level or above (180 nominal hours) School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships can replace VET requirements

## VCE Vocational Major (replacing VCAL for Year 11)

VM is designed for students who don't plan to go to university after secondary school, instead preparing them for an alternative pathway such as an apprenticeship, Vocational Education and Training (VET) or full-time employment.

One of the main benefits of the VM is its emphasis on practical work-related skills, with two of the four strands focusing on providing practical work and industry experience.

Students are able to focus on a specific industry by completing a VET qualification, or complete units from a range of vocational areas. Students can also choose to undertake a structured work placement, an apprenticeship or traineeship, or part-time work.

## Vocational Education Training in Schools (VCE VET)

#### What is VETiS?

Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) is a program that enables students to gain nationally recognised qualifications while at school. Students learn skills and knowledge required for specific industries.

This then improves future employability.



## Vocational Education Training (VCE VET)

VET is a key element of the VCE, and compulsory for students studying VCE Vocational Major.

Students must choose their VET carefully as they will need to remain in their VET for the two years of VCE VM.

Many VCE VET programs offer a scored option for gaining an ATAR score.

## Vocational Education Training (VCE VET)

At Marian, we attempt to offer as many VET subjects as possible at school or within our local School cluster with Ararat College and Stawell Secondary.

Other VET programs can be chosen from the Ballarat/Horsham VET cluster, however they will require a pre-organised payment plan with extra fees/costs (this can be up to \$2500 depending on the course) and independent transport to and from the course.

The option of studying a Unit 3&4 is available. Not only to those students who studied a Unit 1&2 in Year 10

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
### VCE Cont.


